4. Number of times the individual volunteered during the year
5. Number of hours the individual volunteered during the year

Justification must be limited to single page word document in bullet or narrative format. The award will be presented at the June 2008 general membership meeting.

Duties of ASMC Officers:

President: Shall be Chief Executive of the Chapter and shall preside at meetings of the general membership and the Executive Committee. Shall exercise general supervisory control over all officers of the Chapter. Shall appoint special officers and chairpersons of standing and special committees. Shall serve as ex-officio of all committees. Shall execute such papers as may require his/her signature. Shall enforce the bylaws, policies, and directives of the Chapter.

President-Elect: Shall serve for one year as a member of the Executive Committee, chairing the total awards program and shall automatically accede to the office of President for a term of one year.

Vice Presidents: Shall act as advisors to the President and are representatives of their installation or organization. Responsible for formulation and submittal of research papers, manuscripts, and speeches prepared and given by their members.

Secretary: Shall record the proceedings of the meetings, maintain all of the Chapter's documents and papers, be responsible for notifying officers and members of all meetings, and shall perform duties required by the President, other chapter officers, and members to keep them informed of Chapter affairs.

Secretary-Elect: Shall serve for one year, as a member of the Executive Committee as special assistant to the President-elect and then shall automatically accede to the Office of Secretary for a term of one year.

Treasurer: Shall receive and deposit all monies of the Chapter, pay its debts whereas approved and within the amended budget, maintain its books of account, and make appropriate reports on the Chapter's financial conditions and operation to the Executive Committee. The Treasurer will deposit and maintain all monies in local financial institutions consistent with generally accepted accounting principles.

Assistant Treasurer: Shall act in the absence of the Treasurer.

General Counsel: Shall advise the Chapter and Officers in legal matters pertaining to the Chapter and maintain current bylaws and standing rules.

COMPTROLLER EMPLOYEE SCHOLARSHIPS - Lump sum awards of \$400 paid to two individuals for use in actual college expenses.

Certified Defense Financial Manager (CDFM) Award

The Alamo City Chapter is awarding its new CDFM members up to **\$100!!** The purpose of this award is to promote professional development and to congratulate our members for a job well done. You qualify if you pass all three CDFM exams between 1 July 2007 and 30 June 2008 (Module 4 is optional). Proof of certification must be provided to your vice-president as early as possible, but **NO LATER THAN 7 July 08**.

Proof of certification may be provided in one of the 3 forms below:

- 1) a copy of your CDFM certificate
- 2) a copy of the congratulatory letter or e-mail from the National ASMC certification program
- 3) a copy of the pass notification provided by the testing facility (must include name, exam title, and date passed)

Awards will be presented at the July 2008 luncheon. Awards will only be granted to those qualifying during the current program year, July 2007 to June 2008. Awards will not be granted to qualifying individuals who do not notify their chapter vice president by the awards cut off date of **7 July 2007**.

Qualifying recipients unable to attend the July meeting are responsible for providing a valid mailing address to their chapter vice president no later than one week following the July 08 meeting and their check will be mailed to them. Barring unforeseen circumstances, (i.e....emergency leave, short notice deployment, etc.) failure to provide an address in the time required will result in forfeiture of the award.

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PDI 2009

The "OFFICIAL THEME" for PDI 2009 is: **BUILDING THE STARS OF TOMORROW**

WHY DID WE JOIN ASMC?

My reason was to improve, strengthen or develop professional skills, be given the opportunity to demonstrate leadership abilities and build a professional network through participation in ASMC activities.

The Alamo City Chapter will soon host a big extravaganza called PDI 2009. This event will be held in the S.A. Convention Center, where the expected members participating in this (3) day event could be in excess of 3,800.

The PDI program objective is to enhance skills and abilities that personnel in the financial and resource management community must possess to meet the challenges of working in the 21st century. The PDI focus is on education and training, with more than 20 hours of educational sessions and speakers, and the ability to earn up to 26 CPE. These sessions will provide updates to emerging issues and help you transform today for tomorrow's success. Explore trends, develop tactics to tackle your organization's challenges, learn how to master the impossible, and create new ways to think about the future.

For the majority of Financial Managers, continual training for our craft comes none too often. PDI 2009 can be your opportunity to hear briefings from DOD leadership. You can choose from more than 90 workshop sessions and mini-courses. You will participate in Service Day, (6) General Sessions and (4) evening networking opportunities.

We ask you to step forward and bring your skills to join other Chapter members volunteering for this event.

As a volunteer for PDI 2009, you will receive a reduced rate for attending the workshops and each member will receive a volunteer shirt.

Volunteer duties are not full time and you will be provided ample opportunities to attend the Training Sessions.

Provided to you are brief descriptions of each Committee where volunteers are needed...our goal is to recruit at least 125-150 Alamo Chapter members.

ADMINISTRATION: Includes Pre-PDI record keeping, maintaining the Command Center, Volunteer Lounge and General Admin functions. This function is responsible for the Command Center (telephones, message board, equip rentals, office supplies).

HOSPITALITY: Establish/Staff information tables/booth at Hotels, Airport, and Convention Center. Staff doors for luncheons/evening meal activities. Assist Programs Contractor with Assistant Instructors (AIs) for workshops/general sessions. Work in speaker ready room, distribute/collect critique forms.



OPENING/CLOSING CEREMONIES: Select/plan for Honor Guards, Band, Chaplain, Stage Decoration, Rehearsals, and National Anthem and prepare a 20 minute script.

SPECIAL EVENTS: Arrange for special optional events for registrants/guests, i.e. Volksmarch, 5K Run/Walk, Community Service activity.

TECHNOLOGY: Arrange for NetCafe setup with event planner. Provide technical support and control access and usage of Netcafe.

TRANSPORTATION: Coordinate VIP transportation with Protocol; arrange transportation with Chapters coming by Military Air. Prepare baggage tags for MIL Air members, interface with hired Bus Company. Arrange/schedule drivers for Airport trips.

We hope to hear from you and look forward to you joining the team for PDI 2009.

National News

Free On-Line CPE from Previous National Professional Development Institutes (PDIs)

There are 17 sessions from PDI 2007 and about 50 from PDIs 2005-2006 that offer CPE credit (generally 1.5 hours CPE each). Instructions on how to access the free CPE for the PDIs on the National ASMC web-site are included below. The CPE is based on viewing presentations from the National PDI and taking a brief test. Certificates are provided for this training, and can be recalled on-line, if needed.

Start at the National ASMC web-site (<http://www.asmc.org>) or any of the links below

Select "Professional Development" (<http://www.asmc.org/development/>)

Select "Extended Learning" (<http://www.asmc.org/development/extendedlearning.shtml>)

For PDI 2007 presentations:

- Click on "PDI Online" to go to http://live.blueskybroadcast.com/bsb/client/CL_DEFAULT.asp?Client=70
- Click on "Register" to create an account or "Sign In" once you create an account (you create your own user ID and password)
- Click the plus sign ("+") next to "PDI 2007" and then "Workshops" to open the full menu and click on Thursday, Friday, Service Day, or Opening Ceremony to view options (CPE is only available for selected presentations on Thursday and Friday)



- Scroll through the list to select the presentation(s) you want to see. The screen identifies which presentations have tests available for CPE.
- You may be prompted to install Adobe Flash Player 8.0 if you don't have it already (you might need help from your computer folks).
- After viewing the presentation, take the test.
- If you pass the test, you can print a CPE certificate (generally 1.5 CPEs per presentation).
- Your results (assessments) and certificates are also maintained under your user Profile and can be recalled later, if needed.

For PDI 2005-2006 presentations:

- Click on "Virtual Library" (near the bottom of the page) to go to <http://www.blueskypresents.com/storefront/storeFront.asp?cat=4482&sh=1&optSrch=1>
- Click on "Register" to create an account or "Sign In" once you create an account (your email address is your user ID, you create your own password).
- Scroll through the list to select the presentation(s) you want to see. The screen identifies which presentations offer CPE.
- After viewing the presentation, take the test.
- If you pass the test, you can print a CPE certificate (generally 1.5 CPEs per presentation).
- Your results and certificates are also maintained under "Certificates" for PDIs 2005-2006 and can be recalled later, if needed.

You can now earn free CPE credits by listening to or watching workshops and Service Day sessions from the highly successful PDI 2007. You can go to www.asmconline.org/development/extendedlearning.shtml and choose from video or audio versions of the presentations. When you complete a session, you may either self-certify for CPE credit or take a short test and get a CPE certificate.

Register Now for New Module 2 Audio Training

On April 30 and May 01 of 2008, ASMC will offer audio training for Module 2 of the CDFM. The training will take place in two four-hour blocks.
