NATIONAL NEWS

House passes year-long FY2011 Continuing Appropriations Bill. The House narrowly (212-206) passed a FY2011 appropriations bill that funds the government for the rest of the year at \$1.1 trillion, essentially at the FY2010 level and \$45 billion less than the president requested. The bill, entitled the “Full Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2011,” is much more than just a simple continuing resolution (CR). In over 400 pages, it provides detailed instructions on the funding levels and authorities for a large number of programs. Some programs receive additional funding to address administration and members’ priorities, while others receive less than they did in FY2010. And, the bill approves the president’s proposal to freeze federal civilian employees pay in 2011 and 2012. ([see more](#))

ASMC Awards Program. Each year the ASMC Alamo City Chapter and National organization recognize the outstanding accomplishments of members and the defense financial management community through the ASMC achievement awards programs. Achievement awards are presented to individuals and teams who have been nominated for outstanding accomplishment within one of the functional fields of comptrollership:

- Accounting and Finance
- Analysis and Evaluation
- Auditing
- Budgeting
- Business Management
- Comptroller/Deputy Comptroller
- Contractor Support
- Education, Training, and Career Development
- Intern/Trainee
- Resource Management
- Team Achievement (any financial discipline)

Distinguished and Meritorious awards may be presented in each of these categories for efforts at “Major Command Headquarters or Higher” and “Unit Under a Major Command” levels. Judging is based on outstanding performance as evidenced by documentation of impact, complexity/leadership, and resource savings.

Nominations for the Chapter awards must be submitted electronically to Mike Snell (Mike.Snell@us.army.mil), Chapter Awards Chair, not later than **10 January 2011**, using formats provided through the Chapter’s VPs. Nominations for National ASMC Awards must be submitted by **31 January 2011** using the ASMC Awards website. Chapter winners will be recognized at the Chapter’s PDS, **14-15 February 2011**, and National winners will be recognized at the ASMC Professional Development Institute in Minneapolis, **30 May – 3 June 2011**.

Chapter Scholarship for High School Seniors (*Bill Pazeretsky, Scholarship Chair*). The Chapter participates with the Bexar County Scholarship Clearing House (BCSCH) to award two \$500.00 scholarships to eligible high school seniors. The students must be the top 25% of their class, be a dependent of an active or retired DOD employee, and plan to pursue a degree in a financial management discipline. Selection will be based on need, leadership ability, school and community activities, and scholastic achievements. Although it’s too late to submit applications to the senior counselors, Chapter members can still submit the applications for qualified students to Pazeretsky@earthlink.net up to **15 January 2011**. ORGANIZATION SPOTLIGHT

502d Air Base Wing (Joint Base San Antonio)

I am sure most of you have heard of Joint Base San Antonio (JBSA) by now. For the new arrivals on the planet you have just entered a strange and bazaar universe. The Army, Navy, and Air Force working together in mutual support...I am sure this didn't happen back on Pluto. Just as a refresher let me give you a very brief historical review of how we got here.

Back in 2005, Congress (in an attempt to further reduce support costs and make the Services more efficient) identified 12 installations in geographic proximity to consolidate installation support functions. For the San Antonio area this legislation included Fort Sam Houston, Randolph AFB, Lackland AFB, and Camp Bullis. Additionally, other Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) and Service moves to include; the DoD Medical Enlisted Training Campus (METC), Cyber Command, AF Services Agency, Port San Antonio, Army Installation Management Command and Sensor Operator Training, to just name a few, added thousands of personnel and numerous organizations to the support load for JBSA. This magnitude and scope of the largest DoD installation led to a unique organizational construct even for joint basing.

JBSA was designated an Air Force lead location for installation support and the 502d Air Base Wing (ABW) was established in July 2009 under the Air Education and Training Command with an overall budget of \$700M to include O&M in excess of \$600M. The 12th Flying Training Wing and 37th Training were left with their respective missions and funding streams becoming tenants of JBSA. The

same occurred at Fort Sam Houston with an Army Support Agency (ASA) established to provide specific mission support to Army units not transferred to JBSA. Anyone lost yet? The 502d ABW was established and Initial Operating Capability (IOC) was reached in April 2010. Just recently, on 1 October 2010, Full Operating Capability (FOC) was achieved with the 802d Mission Support Group (MSG), Comptroller Squadron (CPTS), and Operating Location-A (OL-A) (Lackland), 902d MSG, CPTS, OL-B (Randolph), 502d MSG & CPTS (Fort Sam Houston) organized and operational under the 502d ABW. At Fort Sam Houston the former Army Garrison was transitioned to an Air Force MSG. Let's look a little closer at the 502d FM organization is unique in the Air Force.

Keeping with the new planet metaphor, FM under JBSA is more like one of its moons. Each functional squadron is triplicated under JBSA. FM is no different. An FM director was established under the 502d ABW Commander with three squadrons aligned under the directorate. Think of it as a Comptroller Group separate from the MSGs. The directorate consists of a Director, Deputy Director, Budget Officer, Administrative Assistant, and three Budget Analysts. The 502d CPTS was stood up with a civilian director and the other two CPTSs are lead by military commanders with all reporting to the Group director. We are still growing into our new organization, clarifying roles, and introducing new AF employees and mission partners to AF policies and procedures, but we are well on our way. Challenges abound, but so do opportunities.
